The Cochrane Temiskaming Resource Centre (CTRC), established in 1976, is seeking Volunteer Board Members to be one (1) of eleven (11) Governors representing the public at large and the service area of Cochrane-Timiskaming District and James and Hudson Bays.



CTRC is a regional Developmental Services provider offering programs across the Districts of Temiskaming and Cochrane including coastal communities along James Bay and Hudson Bay. These programs include ten (10) Residential Care Homes, twenty-two (22) Life Share Host Families, Community Participation Services, and a large multi-disciplinary team offering supports in areas of service access and navigation, clinical services including psychological, speech and language services and early intervention services provided by the Infant Development Program.

The Cochrane Temiskaming Resource Centre also works consultatively with other service agencies and providers, including Community Living Associations, Schools and School Boards,

Hospitals, and any other community based services part of the support network for individuals receiving services from CTRC.

The Board of Governors, from all regions of the service districts, meets monthly ten (10) times a year **(in Timmins and/or by video-conference)** and they provide oversight and direction to the agency in consideration and within the framework of governing legislation, budget and service needs.

The successful new Board Members will be 18 years of age or older and have a genuine interest in the CTRC mission to advance the quality of life of individuals with developmental disabilities through the promotion of supports and services which are person driven, holistic, community based and accountable.

Experience as a volunteer board member, knowledge of Ontario Developmental Services, good governance principles, leadership, community development experience, public relations and overall understanding of non-profit organizations are all considered assets in the role of volunteer board member. Bilingualism is also considered an asset and may be a requirement based on community demographics and overall Board representation balance.
